
Parent/Carer Questionnaire January 2024

In total we had 61 responses.




At our school, we place great importance on the happiness and well-being of our students.

Ensuring a positive learning environment is crucial, and we understand that a happy child is more likely to succeed academically. We strive to create an atmosphere where every child feels valued, supported, and included.

- 1. **Put their bee in the box:** Encourage your child to express their feelings to their class teacher. Our teachers are skilled in providing support and guidance to address any concerns.
- 2. **Open door policy:** Parents/carers are welcome to approach their child's class teacher, headteacher, or other members of staff if they have any worries or queries. Our open-door policy means that we are accessible and ready to listen.
- 3. **Email staff:** If parents/carers prefer written communication, they can email the office to initiate a discussion or seek guidance.
- 4. Talk to the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) on the gate: Our SLT members are available on the school gate before and after school hours. They are happy to address any concerns parents may have regarding their child's happiness or wellbeing.





The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved 61 responses





I believe that parental involvement plays a crucial role in a child's educational success. To foster strong partnerships between home and school, we provide several avenues for parents/carers to stay involved and participate actively.

Parents/Carers Meetings: We have two parent/carer's meetings sharing important updates, academic progress, targets and address any concerns or queries. These meetings serve as an opportunity for parents/carers to gain a deeper understanding of what their child will be learning and how they can support their educational development.

Homework related to Weekly Topics: Homework is an essential reinforcement tool, and it is directly tied to the topics covered each week in the classroom.

Termly Overviews: At the beginning of each term, we provide parents/carers with comprehensive overviews for each year group. These overviews outline the teaching objectives, key topics, and areas of focus for that specific term.

Tests Sent Home: We send home tests at least three times a year. These tests provide valuable insights into areas of strengths and areas requiring further support. They serve as a parent/carer-child discussion tool to celebrate achievements and identify areas that may need additional attention.

Tapestry for EYFS and SEND Children: This platform allows parents, carers, teachers and TA's to share observations, achievements, and progress of individual SEND children. It enhances communication and ensures that the child's support needs are met effectively.



Knowledge Organisers: We provide knowledge organizers, which outline the important concepts, facts, and vocabulary related to each topic.



When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly 61 responses




My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school 61 responses






